## EYFS News

2016 is off to an adventurous start, with Reception class exploring the Challenge question 'What makes a Wild Rumpus?'. Next week they will be continuing to work in groups to script and design their very own performances for a receptive Year 4 audience!

In Maths we are learning our numbers 10-15, specifically focusing on 1 more or 1 fewer using a number line.

In Literacy we are learning our own version of 'Where the Wild Things Are' and will be describing the beasts, and inventing our own.

Ideas for Home Learning: You could invent a dance, song, poem or rap with your child which they could use for their 'Rumpus'. You could explore a number line 0-20, and play games involving the numbers 0-15. You could make a mask using materials and fabrics or a boat to travel to a faraway world. Please Note: Reading Books (with a yellow reading record) will now be coming home on a Friday in addition to Phonics books. Both books will be changed every Friday, so please ensure they are in your child's book bag.
