## EYFS News

This week, we have been continuing to learn and practise our target text 'So Much'. In Maths we started discussing Units of Measure, such as length, size and weight. We have also been exploring 'Autumn' and have been looking at the changing seasons. We had lots of fun at Forest School collecting sticks, and comparing lengths to make our stick families. Thank you to Oliver's Mummy for accompanying us this week. As a treat for all their hard work (and an opportunity to assess their physical development) we will be going to the playground next Monday during our Forest School outing, weather permitting. Next week in literacy we will be learning a simplified version of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. We will be comparing the size of the bears in Maths (bigger, smaller, biggest, smallest, medium-sized), as well as discussing volume and capacity (empty, half-full, full), while we prepare and make more porridge for the hungry bears. A copy of our story can be found in your child's book bag. If you would like to, you could read this story together at home and practise some of the key refrains.

Ideas for Home Learning: You could write a recipe together for making porridge, or write a list of ingredients. You could cut some strips of paper and practise ordering them by length. You could compare toys, and discuss which is the heaviest and which is the lightest. Have a great weekend!
