



Head's Message

We've been dancing the week away! Ranging from Victorian inspired moves to African dance, children in Reception up to Year 3 have enjoyed partaking in a dance workshop. Year 4 and 5 will be dancing next week. If you're lucky the children may even teach you a few moves!

On Monday, all staff participated in MindUp training, which is a framework that aims to provide children with an understanding of how the brain influences their thinking, emotions and behaviour in the setting of a mindful classroom. Our goal is that every child in the school will start to identify key parts of the brain, including the **amygdala** (the part of our brain responsible for fight, flight or freeze), **pre-frontal cortex** (the part of the brain that is responsible for decision making) and the **hippocampus** (the part of the brain that holds our memories) and become proficient in strategies to boost their readiness for learning. Watch out for Conway neuroscientists!

Next Thursday is World Book Day – make sure you have your character costume at the ready! See you on Monday!


