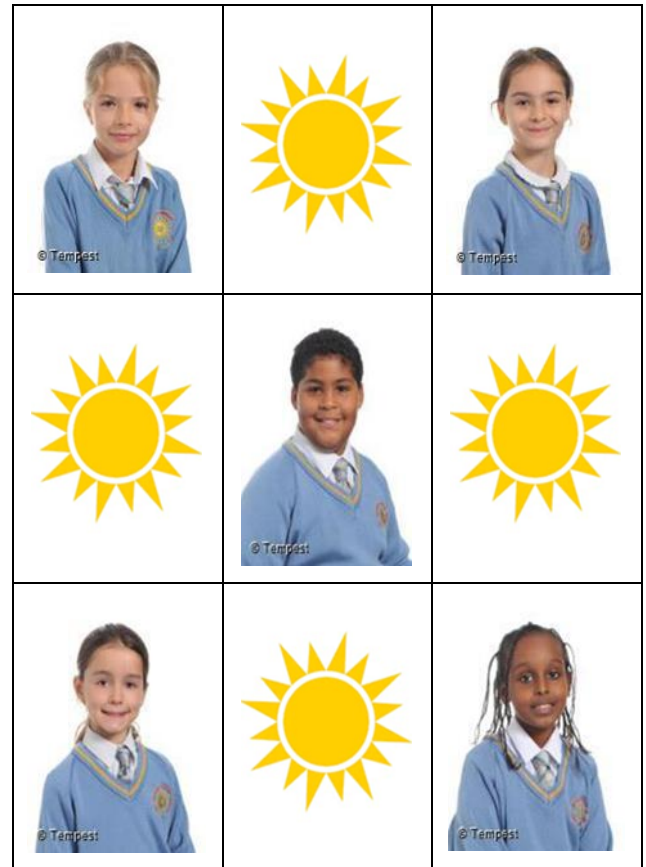

Home Learning

Reception: This week, we have been learning about who keeps us healthy in our circle times. Pick one person in your community who keeps you healthy, such as a dentist or optician, and tell me how they do this. Present your work by drawing, writing, or both!

Year 1: This week in Maths, we have been learning to add a 1-digit number to a 2-digit number (e.g. 45 + 3). How many examples of this type of maths can you find in real life? A good place to start might be your toys, cooking or even a trip to the supermarket! Share your ideas on Seesaw.

Year 2: This week we learnt about how we can be energy efficient with water. How are you energy efficient with water at home? Present your work in any way you like.

Year 3: This week we have been learning all about leaves and science! Can you design an experiment which shows that plants need light? Share your home learning on Seesaw so we can look at it together in class!

Year 4: What foods did the Ancient Maya eat? Can you create a dish at home inspired by Ancient Maya ingredients?

Year 5: In health, we have been learning about eating well and having a balanced diet. Plan a delicious but balanced three-course meal, noting the ingredients you would need to use and the nutrients you would get from each part. Be creative!

Year 6: What is the difference between a series and a parallel circuit? Create a labelled diagram of each and explain the differences. Use any materials you can and upload an image or video to SeeSaw.
