
Head's Message

Year 3's day was fantastico, as they took inspiration from the European




country of Italy. They wrote and practised Italian phrases before then making their very own pasta!

Home Learning

Reception: This week, we have been learning about where we live and the places we have been. Speak to the adults at home about the places you have been and the animals you have experienced. Look at photographs of these experiences or find pictures of the animals and places on the internet. Please share these on Seesaw so that we can add them to our classroom display!

Year 1: Madison really wants to go to space one day but doesn't know what it would be like to live there. Could you research what it is like to live in space?

Year 2: This week we made a wormery! Can you find out about a different animals habitat? You could do some research or see if you can find any outside. Present your work in any way you like.

Year 3: We have been exploring a number of fairy tales by The Brothers Grimm this week and talking about how these stories are known around the world. What can you tell me about these brothers and their stories? How widely read are they? Present your findings in a way that can be used in our upcoming exhibition!

Year 4: What is lifelike as a child in the Yanomami tribe? How is this similar or different to life as a child living in London?

Year 5: In science we have been learning about separating mixtures. For your home learning, either research different ways to separate mixtures or make your own mixture with solids and liquids (ie. water, stones, dry rice) and try to separate it back into its parts!

Year 6: We are about to move into the World War 2 Phase of our topic on Conflict and Resolution. What do you know about life in Britain during this time? Present your findings however you wish!
