

Ark Conway Primary Academy PE and Sport Grant Funding 2018/2019

Background

Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. This funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2017 to 2018 academic year so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

As part of the Government's childhood obesity strategy (August 2016), additional money is expected to be made available for these grants in future years. Ofsted will assess the effectiveness of the spending of this money.
