

What to do today

IMPORTANT! Parent or Carer – Read this page with your child and check that you are happy with what they have to do and with any weblinks or use of the Internet required.

1. It's reading time!

Re-read *No Thank You!* for the last time.

- Once again, say the animals' *No thank you!* line in a characterful way.
- Also add in appropriate 'no thank you' actions – shaking your head, turning way, crossing your arms, looking cross, wagging a finger, etc.

2. Planning a new version of a story

Get ready to write your own version of *No Thank You!*, featuring new animals and foods.

- Use the *Story Planner* to record which three *animals* will be in your story, which funny *foods* they will be given and what they will *say*.
- Include a really good describing word or words for each animal and each food on your *Planner*: e.g. *enormous dog* and *juicy green lettuce*.
- If you want, your animal can say *No thank you* and something else: *I don't like lettuce; I eat meat; Take it away... says the dog.* etc.

3. Writing a new version of a story

Use a copy of the *Leaflet* to write out your new story.

- Write in punctuated sentences with capital letter and full stops at the end of each sentence.
- Put an exclamation mark instead of a full stop after *No thank you!*

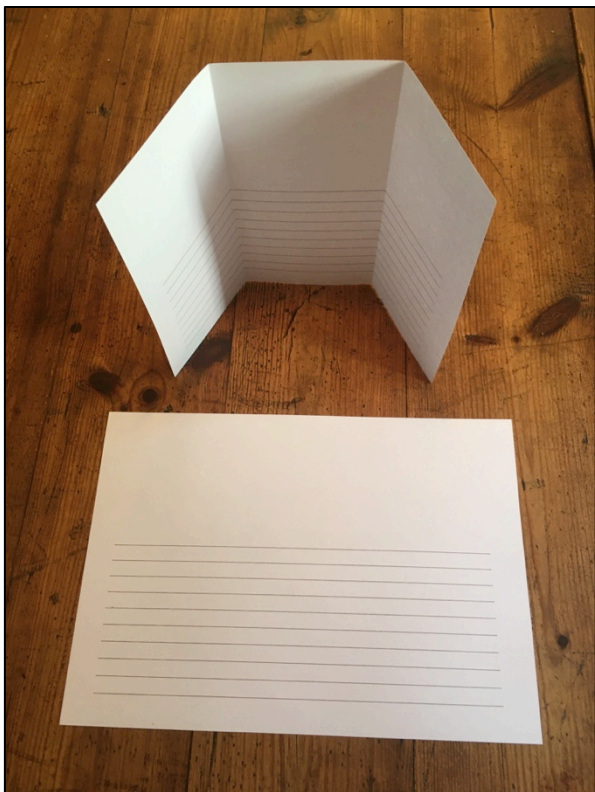
Now try these Fun-Time Extras

Making a Leaflet Book for No Thank You!



1. Print off the [Leaflet](#) sheet below.
2. Fold into thirds so that you have three pages, one for each animal and their food.
3. Children convert their plan into a completed story by transcribing sentences onto their leaflet.
4. They draw pictures to go with each part of their story.
5. Fold the leaflet closed and write the story's title and the name of the author on the front cover.
6. Add any other illustrations wanted.
7. If possible, copy the leaflet and get chn to send or email it to relatives.
